






Nile Rua Exploring The Fibonacci Sequence

Nile Rua is exploring topics involving Algebra for mathematics. One aspect is the Fibonacci sequence. This sequence is a set of integers (the Fibonacci numbers) that starts with a zero, followed by a one, then by another one, and then by a series of steadily increasing numbers. The sequence follows the rule that each number is equal to the sum of the preceding two numbers. The Fibonacci sequence shows up in many places, in mathematics and, remarkably, in nature. The Fibonacci sequence can describe branches on a tree, sequences in music, the number of petals on a flower, Pascal's triangle, paintings, structural design, human anatomy, the shape of a spiral, and more.


