On that day our kaikao and myself went to collaborate with Hampden Street School enabling us all to work on the refreshed curriculum. For over a year now we have been getting to know the new requirements for Aotearoa New Zealand Histories, Social Sciences, English and Mathematics. Last week we eplored reading writing and maths. Working with professionals from our local Kāhui Ako Schools iis inpsiring with the sharing of knowldge, ideas and skills. Next year we will be implementing the new elements of the English and maths curriuum. There will be a new way of working. The new government also has ideas about the delivery of core curriculum but as yet we haven't' had any specifics. Untilthen we will continue on the pathway we have begun. The changes so far are that the curriculum levels that we assess by currently, change to Phases. There are 5 phases that start at primary school and finsh at the end of secondary schooling. Phase 1 is Years 1-3, Phase 2, Years 4-6, Phase 3, Years 7-8. These are the ones that relate to us.

The curriculum objectives are framed under Know, Understand, and Do. There are learning objectives that sit under these headings for each phase.
