Freeville School caters for students from 5 to 13 years of age. It is situated in North New Brighton in the eastern suburbs of Christchurch, between the Avon River and QE 2 Park. Consequently the impact of the earthquake, both at school, and in the community surrounding the school has been significant. We know that in order to learn kids have to be at school. To be at school they have to be healthy. To be healthy they have to be warm. We know our kids are in damaged homes, that many have split concrete pads, chimneys are down and we are expecting power cuts over winter. We want to make sure that our kids, at the very least, have a warm jacket.

Macpac are a Christchurch based company and as such are able to empathise with what our community is going through. They have generously agreed to supply high quality down jackets at the greatly reduced cost of \$50 each. We are now looking for sponsorship so that we can get all our kids a warm winter jacket.
